## Priest Profile: Fr. Rob Jack

Fr. Rob Jack is an instructor of Systematic Theology at Mount St Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati. Born and raised in Middletown Ohio and the oldest of 3 children, he graduated from Fenwick High School in 1983 and the Josephinum in 1987,

with ordination to the priesthood in 1992, but he knew at his First Communion that he would be a priest.

An early assignment at Chaplain at Jewish hospital continues to influence his priesthood, as Fr. Jack says, "it was when I began working with the sick that I really learned what it means to be a priest. It is when you are on the front lines, dealing with issues of life, suffering and death, that you realize things get very simple and down to the basics of faith, hope and charity."

One of the principles he tries to impart on the seminarians he teaches, is that in order to be a good priest, he must get involved in people's lives and have a deep

understanding of Catholic doctrine in order to pass it on to others.

Finally, Fr. Jack says that his prayer life is 'at the center of all I do.' In addition to celebrating Mass and praying the Liturgy of the Hours, he has a special devotion to Our Lady, particularly through praying the Rosary.

Father Jack has a new website [www.EcceSacerdos.com](http://www.EcceSacerdos.com) (Behold the Priest) for the renewal of the priesthood. It will be kicked off on September 3, the Feast of St. Gregory the Great.

When asked what he would tell a young man who might be interested in the priesthood, Fr. Jack simply responded: 'Pray, listen and serve the needs others.'

## The Holy Father Speaks

"There is nothing more beautiful than to be surprised by the Gospel, by the encounter with Christ. There is nothing more beautiful than to know Him and to speak to others of our friendship with Him." ## Prayer Intentions, September



**OUR LADY OF SORROWS -  
SEPTEMBER 15**

This month features Our Lady of Sorrows, celebrated on Monday, September 15<sup>th</sup>. With origins in the Gospels of John 19:25, Mary standing at the foot of the cross,

and Luke 2:35, "Your own soul a sword shall pierce," the present form of this devotion includes the following scripture based "Seven Sorrows":

1. Prophecy of Simeon (Lk 2, 34-35)
2. Flight into Egypt (Mt 2, 13-21)
3. Loss of Jesus for three days (Lk 2, 41-50)
4. Ascent to Calvary (Jn 19, 17)
5. Crucifixion and death of Jesus (Jn 19, 18-30)
6. Jesus taken down from the cross (Jn 19, 39-40)
7. Jesus laid in the tomb (Jn 19, 40-42)

### Outline of Prayer for Sept

- Rosary: Sorrowful Mysteries
- Scripture Reading: Read one of the Seven Sorrows and meditate on it.
- Go to a church a privately pray the Stations of the Cross focusing on Mary's sorrow.

**A project for Children:** Have them choose one of the Seven Sorrows and read them the story. Have them explain why Mary is sorrowful. Pray one decade of the Sorrowful Mysteries together.

**Sacrifice:** On Sept 15, Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, consider fasting (or partial fast) for reparation for offenses against the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary.

**Charity:** Priests often like music and books—give them a gift card to a book store or Amazon.
